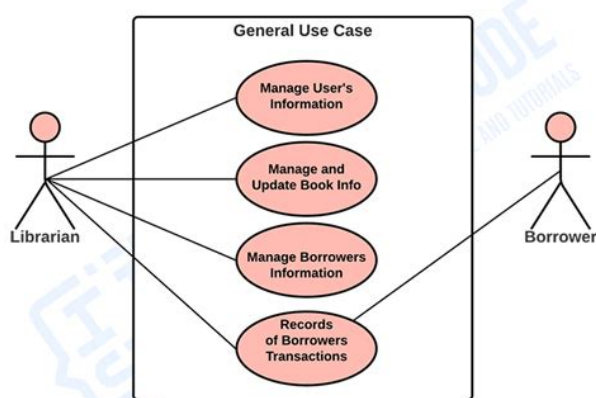


Behavioral Health Homes Pathways Behavioral Health Home is an innovative and holistic approach to wellness and health promotion. Care Coordinators ensure that a youth's primary care medical and dental needs are well integrated with any behavioral health services so that all providers are working together effectively and any gaps in care are addressed immediately. Youth and families also have access to other Health Home staff at Pathways such as Peer Support Specialists and Nurse Care Managers. Availability of this service is limited and requires meeting eligibility criteria. This will be explained during the intake process. You will work one on one with your case manager and create an Individualized Service Plan which will guide treatment. Does your mental health compromise your level of community interaction. Do you find accessing transportation to be challenging At your intake appointment you can expect to be asked questions about your background, mental illness and current struggles. Due to the amount of information that must be gathered during this appointment, you can expect this meeting to last 12 hours. After intake is completed you will be assigned a case manager within 7 business days. You can expect that your case manager will support you with. Previously known as the Case Management System with the Court officers known as Case Management Officers or "CMO", under revised Maine law the CMOs are now known as Magistrates, although their powers remain basically the same. A Case Management Conference is typically scheduled fairly soon after the commencement of the case and the Magistrates guide the case through the Court system insuring the timely progress of the case.

In addition, unless specifically waived by either party, the Magistrate may make interim temporary orders addressing which spouse will have the use of the marital home, responsibility for marital bills and debts, temporary support and spousal support, temporary parental rights and responsibilities for children under the age of 18, and responsibility for interim attorneys fees. 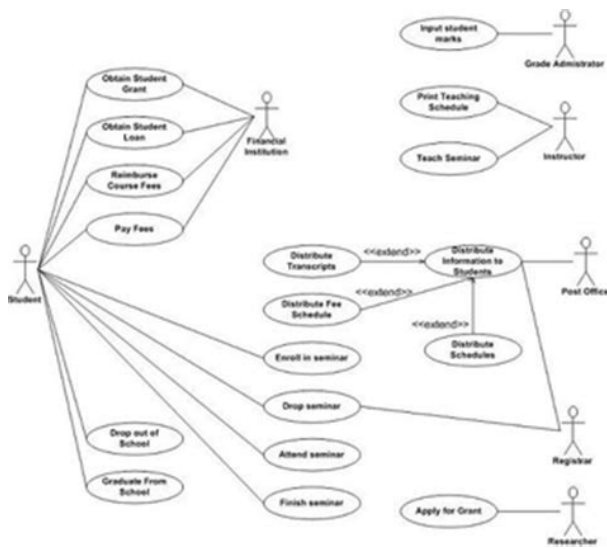
USE CASE DIAGRAM

You have the right to review your record at any reasonable time. You may add written comments to your record to clarify information you believe is inaccurate or incomplete. No one else can see your record unless you specifically authorize them to see it, except in instances described in the complete rights book. The plan must be in writing and you have the right to a copy. The plan needs to specifically detail what everyone will do, the time frames in which the tasks and goals will be accomplished and how success will be determined. The plan must be based upon your actual needs and, if a needed service is not available, detail how your need will be met. If you have a guardian, he or she is authorized to make decisions without your consent. You have the right to be informed of the possible risks and anticipated benefits of all services and treatment, including medications, in a manner which you understand. If you have any questions, you may ask your worker or anyone else you choose before making decisions about treatment or services. If a guardian has been authorized to make decisions for you, the guardian has the right to be fully informed of all risks and benefits or proposed treatment or services. If you wish a representative, you must designate this person in writing. You can have access to the representative at any time you wish and you can change or cancel the designation at any time. You cannot be secluded or restrained in the community setting. You have the right to bring a grievance to challenge any possible violation of your rights or any questionable practices. You have the right to have your grievance answered in writing, with reasons for the decisions. You may appeal any decision to the Office of Adult Mental Health Services. You may not be punished in any way for filing a grievance. You cannot be retaliated against for filing a

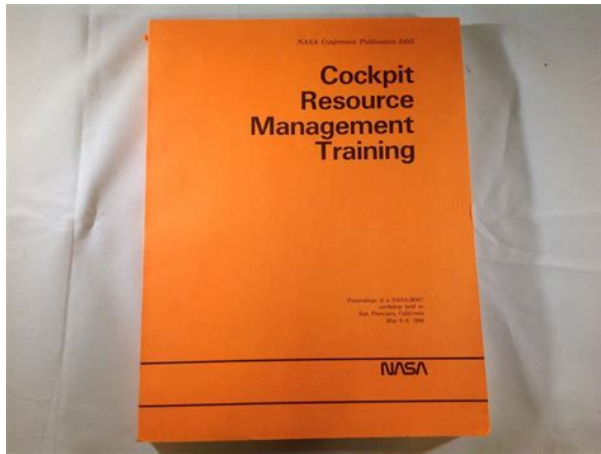

What You Should Know When it's fully operational, approximately 85% of the electronic documents submitted by filers will be immediately accessible for public inspection upon acceptance by the court. With a few exceptions e.g., certain adoption, child protection, juvenile, and mental health civil commitment records, all criminal, civil, and traffic infractions records would be publicly available. Some records would be accessible only at the courthouse, while others would be accessible to the public both remotely via the internet and at the courthouse. But, critically, the SJC intends to rely almost entirely on individual filers to ensure compliance with those new rules. The odds for Maine citizens are not good. A court may impose sanctions on any party or person filing a noncompliant document." The risks of noncompliance are real and substantial. An individual may lose rights to a claim forever if a statute of limitations is missed because a filing was deemed not to have been filed correctly or a person may lose a lawsuit or pay a fine. Although they are not published, the numbers are similar in other district court case types. There are hundreds of Maine laws and regulations in existence that treat certain information as confidential. And the volume of new laws enacted each year is likely to continue to grow, given the increasing recognition of the need for stronger consumer data protection laws and regulations. Finding and keeping track of these laws, not to mention reading and understanding them, will be a major undertaking for Maine lawyers and an impossible hurdle for unrepresented litigants. In any event, the privacy interests of nonparties are at risk too and should not be entrusted solely to the care of one of the parties. While its draft rules designate "death certificates" as nonpublic, they make no reference to "birth certificates." Yet the latter document contains precious "place of birth" and "mother's maiden name" information.

Like many states, Maine is a “closed state” as it relates to vital records, making such records available for inspection by the public that is, open to anyone only after passage of a long period of time birth records more than 75 years from the date of the event; marriage records more than 50 years from the date of the event; and death records more than 25 years from the date of the event. In 2010, however, the legislature enacted “An Act To Allow Electronic Filing of Vital Records and Closing of Records To Guard Against Fraud and Make Other Changes to the Vital Records Laws.” As state government transitioned from paper to electronic records, Maine decided that restricting access to vital records only to those with “a direct and legitimate interest in the matter recorded” was necessary to protect Maine citizens from fraud and identity theft. It did so, even in the face of knowledge that much of the vital records information would be otherwise readily available to the public through newspapers, the U.S. Social Security Death Index, and cemetery gravestones. What about those who do not speak English, cannot read well, do not have access to a law library, are going through a divorce, seeking help for their children, or fearing for their lives at the time of filing Judging by a quick look at the search solutions presently available from Tyler Technologies, it seems that functionality and technological filters already exist or could be built to help ensure that data has been sufficiently deidentified and that all nonpublic cases, documents, and information have been correctly identified and properly marked. No technology is foolproof. But if it is used in conjunction with other measures e.g., user training, manual review, and judicial oversight, technology should at least help to increase Maine citizens’ odds. Relying on filers to serve the privacy gatekeeping function is fraught with peril and not good public policy.

DHHS bills the consumer directly for their monthly cost of care. Covered services under HCB include Care Coordination, Personal Care Services, Nurse, Adult Day, Homemaker, Occupational Therapy, Physical Therapy, Speech and Language Therapy, Masters Social Work, Environmental Modifications, Emergency Response Service, and Respite.
