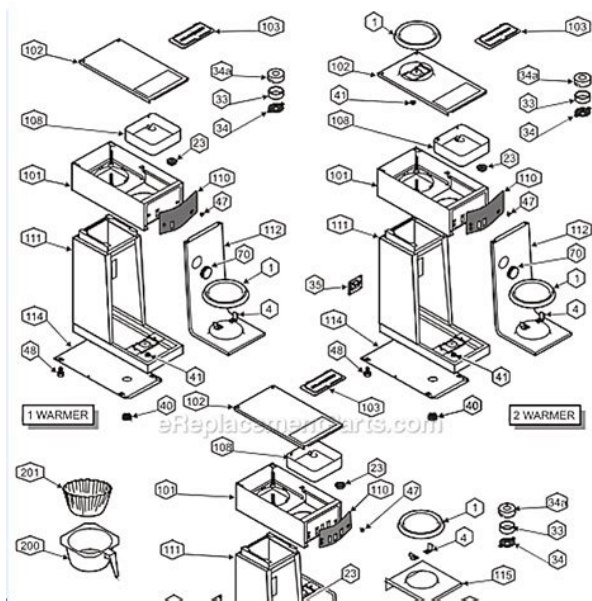

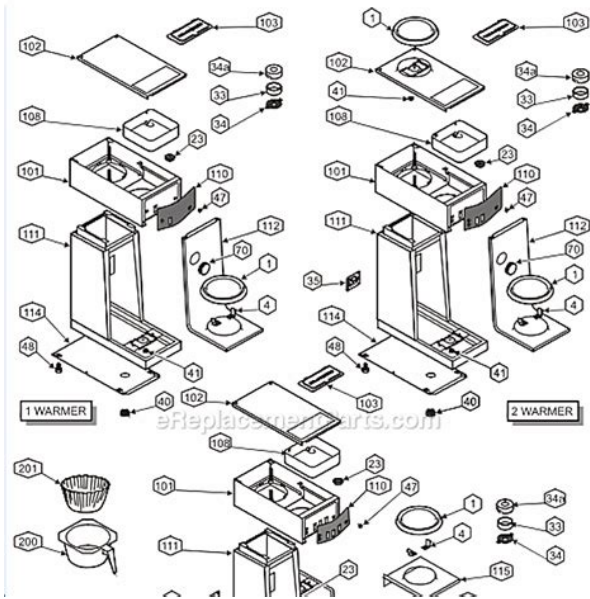
SPECIAL CORD SET INSTRUCTIONS A short power supply cord is provided to reduce the risks resulting from becoming entangled in or tripping over a longer cord. Longer extension cords are available and may be used if care is exercised in their use. If a long extension cord is used, the marked electrical rating of the extension cord must be at least as great as the electrical rating of the appliance, and the longer cord should be arranged so that it will not drape over the countertop or tabletop where it can be pulled on by children or tripped over. **NOTICE** This appliance has a polarized plug one blade is wider than the other. To reduce the risk of electric shock, this plug will fit into a polarized outlet only one way. If the plug does not fit fully into the outlet, reverse the plug. If it still does not fit, contact a qualified electrician. Do not modify the plug in any way. The quality of that water is as important as the quality of your coffee. If water doesn't taste good from the tap, it won't taste good in your coffee. Cuisinart includes a charcoal water filter to remove chlorine, bad tastes and odors, for the purest coffee flavor, every time you brew. **Element 2 Coffee** While coffee is 98% water, all of the flavor comes from the beans. To achieve the same great taste you enjoy at a coffee bar, buy only a two-week supply of fresh coffee beans at a time. Once the bean is broken, its flavor degrades quickly. That's why Cuisinart grinds your beans just prior to brewing. **Element 3 Grind** The grind is critical for proper flavor extraction. If the grind is too fine, overextraction and bitterness will result. Too fine a grind may also clog the filter. If grind is too coarse, the water will pass through too quickly and the maximum flavor will not be extracted. Your coffeemaker is preset for medium, the optimal grind for this type of brewing process. **Element 4 Proportion** Coffee that is too strong or too weak is always a disappointment.

Follow the recommended portions of whole beans or ground coffee in the instructions under **MAKING COFFEE**, and later adjust the amount to your taste. See detailed drawing on page 6. 2. Hour and Minute Buttons Use to program clock and Auto On function. Grind Off Button with LED Indicator Turns off the grinder when using preground coffee. Entering Time Set Mode Hold down the Hour or Minute button until the clock begins flashing. Press either button to select the desired time. Hold buttons down to scroll through the digits, or press and release to advance one digit at a time. When scrolling, the numbers will advance slowly and then speed up. When the number displayed approaches the desired time, press and release to advance one digit at a time. Be sure the PM indicator is on if a PM time is desired. Exiting Time Set Mode a. SETTING THE PROGRAM TIME When you press the Program set button, it displays a previously selected autoon time, or the default time 1200pm. Set the time you want coffee to begin brewing by following the instructions in "Entering Time Set Mode." The coffeemaker will start to brew at the programmed time. MAKING COFFEE WITH WHOLE BEANS Follow instructions in "Before Brewing Your First Pot of Coffee" above. 1. Fill the Water Reservoir Open the reservoir cover and pour in water, using the water level window indicator to measure the number of cups desired. NOTE Do not exceed the 10cup line. Doing so could cause carafe to overflow. 3. Add Beans Lift the grinder basket lid, using the recess on either side. Fill the basket with the desired quantity of beans. NOTE Use 1 level scoop of whole beans per cup. For 1 to 4 cups, use 1 level scoops per cup. Do not add over 14 scoops. BEFORE BREWING YOUR FIRST POT OF COFFEE We recommend flushing out the system before brewing your first pot of coffee. Once you've done that, brew a pot of real coffee and get ready to enjoy Cuisinart at its best! Close Reservoir Cover Lid Press down to lock. This coffee maker is equipped with a safety interlock system, which prevents the unit from operating if the cover is open or the grinder cover is left out. If you try to turn the unit on with the cover open, the unit will beep continuously until the missing parts are installed and you close the lid. If you open the cover during the grinding process, it will beep, the grinder will stop grinding and, if brewing, the brewing will stop. Once the missing parts are in place and the cover is closed, the beeping stops. The brewing process can be restarted by pressing the On button. Restarting the process will not affect coffee results. If you do not want the grinder to come on again, press the Grind Off button before pressing the On button. 7. Prepare the Carafe Remove thermal carafe lid by turning in the direction of the "unlock" arrow. This ensures cover is closed and in the proper position for brewing and pouring. Make sure you have replaced the thermal carafe in its position on the resting plate. 8. Brewing To Brew Right Away a. Push the 14 cup button if you are brewing fewer than 5 cups. NOTE Coffeemakers traditionally produce cooler coffee when brewing small pots because the heater doesn't have time to warm up.



Red LED will light up and brewing will begin. To Program Brew Time a. To select the time you want coffee to start brewing, press the Program button and hold it. The time displayed in the window is the programmed start time. To change time, follow "Setting The Program Time" instructions on page 7. b. Push the 14 cup button if you are brewing fewer than 5 cups. c. Press and release Program button. Green LED indicates that the unit is in programmed start mode and the brew cycle will begin at the time you selected. 9. After Brewing When brew cycle is complete, five beeps will sound and unit will automatically shut itself off. Coffee will continue to stream from the filter for several seconds. The thermal carafe will keep coffee hot for hours. Bottom of thermal carafe is hot to touch for several minutes after brewing. Preserve freshness by minimizing exposure to air, light, and moisture. Once beans are removed from the freezer, keep them in a sealed container at room temperature, since damaging condensation can occur when beans move from cold to warmer temperatures. Adjust the recipe according to taste. NOTE The maximum capacity for ground coffee is 16 level scoops, using either a paper or permanent filter. Inserting the Water Filter 3FNPWF UIF GJMUFGSPNQPMZCBH BOE soak it, fully immersed, in cold tap water for 15 minutes. NOTE We recommend changing the water filter every 60 days or after 60 uses, and more often if you have hard water. Be aware that using this feature will weaken the flavor strength of the finished pot, because the flavor profile of coffee brewed at the beginning of the cycle differs from coffee made at the end. NOTE Removing carafe for more than 20 seconds may cause filter basket to overflow. Remove the grinder basket lid by using the recessed areas on each side of the lid. Then remove

grinder basket. Open filter basket door. Remove filter basket cover, filter basket and filter basket holder.

The grinder basket, grinder basket lid, filter basket and filter basket cover can be washed in warm soapy water and rinsed thoroughly, or cleaned in the upper rack of the dishwasher. Dry all parts after every use. Do not put any water in the unit once the grinder basket has been removed. Wipe the area under the grinder basket with a damp cloth. If water gets into the grinder motor, the motor may become damaged and may malfunction. Once clean, reverse the above steps. Remove the carafe from the resting plate. Discard any remaining coffee. The carafe and lid can be washed in warm soapy water and rinsed thoroughly, or placed in a dishwasher. The carafe and carafe lid should be placed on the upper rack only. Do not use scouring agents or harsh cleansers on any part of the coffeemaker. Never immerse base unit in water or other liquid. To clean base, simply wipe with a clean, damp cloth and dry before storing. Wipe resting plate with a clean, damp cloth. Never use rough, abrasive materials or cleansers to clean the resting plate. Open the lid 60 and gently pull toward you. To replace, reverse steps. **DECALCIFICATION** Decalcification refers to removing the calcium deposits which form over time on the metal parts of the coffeemaker. For best performance from your coffeemaker, decalcify the base unit from time to time. The frequency depends upon the hardness of your tap water and how often you use the coffeemaker. To clean, fill the water reservoir to capacity with a mixture of white vinegar and water. Turn the coffeemaker on by pressing the ON button. One cycle should be sufficient to adequately clean the coffeemaker. When the cycle is completed and five beeps sound, turn coffeemaker off. Repeat operation, this time using fresh cold water. Except as otherwise required under applicable law, this warranty is not available to retailers or other commercial purchasers or owners.

Style Name Thermal Carafe The unit comes equipped with a builtin burr grinder, which automatically grinds beans right before brewing, and its grindcontrol function makes it easy to program the amount of coffee to grindfrom 2 to 12 cups. In addition, its strength selector allows for choosing from strong, medium, or mild coffee. The units bean hopper holds up to a half pound of beans and comes with a sealed lid to prevent moisture. Other highlights include automatic shutoff after brewing, a grindoff option, and an integrated 2 to 4cup feature, as well as a Gold tone commercialstyle permanent filter and charcoal water filter to remove impurities, and a brewpause function for sneaking a cup midbrew. A 12cup 5 ounces each doublewall insulated thermal carafe comes included, which seals in heat and freshness so the last cup tastes as good as the first. Add to that the pleasure of choosing the flavor strength you like best, easytouse controls, and a thermal carafe that keeps coffee hot and fresh for hours and youll understand why we say this Cuisinart coffeemaker is a grind above the rest. The Quest for a Perfect Espresso It is generally agreed that there are four basic elements critical to the perfect cup Element 1. Water Coffee is 98% water. Often overlooked, the quality of the water is as important as the quality of the coffee.

A good rule of thumb is that if your water doesnt taste good from the tap, it wont taste any better in your coffee. The charcoal water filter removes chlorine, bad tastes and odors, for the purest cup of coffee every time. Element 2. Coffee While the bulk of the liquid is water, all of the flavor should be from the coffee. To achieve the same great quality of coffee you receive at a coffee bar, you need to use the same quality beans. Buy the beans fresh and whole, only about a two weeks supply at a time for maximum freshness. Once the coffee bean is broken, its flavor degrades very quickly. If it is not practical to buy small supplies, we recommend you separate larger amounts of beans into one to two week portions immediately after purchase, and freeze them in airtight containers. The best way to maximize freshness is to minimize exposure to air, light and moisture. So, once beans have been removed from the freezer, maintain them in a sealed container at room temperature, since damaging

condensation occurs every time the beans are removed from the freezer or refrigerator. Note that some coffee experts advise against freezing darkroast beans, because freezing can cause the oils to coagulate. Other experts disagree. We suggest you experiment and decide yourself. We recommend keeping the hopper at least half way full. Be sure that you have sufficient amount of beans in your hopper for the amount of coffee you intend to brew. Although it is preferable to use fresh, whole beans, you can make coffee in the coffeemaker using preground beans. To do so, turn off the grinder by pressing the Grind Off button before turning on the unit. It is suggested to use 1 level scoop of ground coffee per cup and adjust the amount to your taste. The maximum capacity for ground coffee is 16 level scoops, using either a paper or permanent filter. Exceeding this amount may cause overflow. Element 3. Grind The grind of the coffee is critical for proper flavor extraction.

If the grind is too fine, over extraction and bitterness will result. Too fine a grind may also clog the filter. If the grind is too coarse, the water will pass through too quickly and the desired flavors will not be extracted. Making Coffee with Whole Beans 12cup thermal caraffe Fill the Water Reservoir Open the reservoir lid. Pour the desired amount of water in the reservoir using the water level window indicator. Close the reservoir lid. Note Do not exceed the 12cup line; doing so may cause the carafe to overflow. Add Beans Lift the hopper lid, using the recess on either side. Fill the hopper with beans. It is recommended keeping the hopper at least halfway full. Overpacking may result in jamming the grinder. For easy filling, the hopper container can be taken out by turning the hopper container release knob to the unlock position. Note Do not put any water in the unit once the hopper container has been removed. If the water gets into the grinder motor, the motor may become damaged and may malfunction. Put hopper lid back in place. Lock Hopper If you have removed the hopper from the unit, be sure that the hopper container release knob is in the unlocked position and place the hopper container back in the unit. Turn the knob to locked position. This unit is equipped with a safety interlock system. The unit will not grind if the hopper container is not in place. If you try to turn on the unit for grinding with the hopper out of place, the unit will beep continuously until the missing part is installed. The brewing process can be restarted by pressing the On button. Restarting the process will not affect coffee results. Insert Coffee Filter Open filter door by pressing filter basket door release button. The unit is equipped with a safety interlock system. The units will not operate if the filter basket cover or filter basket are not in place or if the filter door is not closed.

If you try to turn the unit on while the filter compartment is out of place, the unit will beep continuously until the missing parts are installed. Brewing Immediate Grinding and Brewing Turn the Grind Control Knob to select the number of cups you want to brew. The coffeemaker will grind the corresponding amounts of beans. The unit will automatically adjust for low cup settings. Press the Strength Control button to set the coffee strength. MILD, MED or STRONG will show on the LCD display. Press the On button. The indicator will light and process will begin. Programmed Brewing Press the Program button. The indicator will light and the display will show the programmed time for as long as the button is depressed. The display reverts back to the time of day once the button is released. Turn the Grind Control knob to select the number of cups you want to brew. The Coffeemaker will grind the corresponding amount of beans. Press the Strength Control button to set coffee strength. The coffeemaker will begin brewing at the programmed time. During and After Brewing The Brew Pause feature allows you to remove the carafe from the resting plate during midbrew. The brewing process does not stop during this period; only the flow of coffee from the basket stops. Do not remove the carafe for longer than 20 seconds or the coffee may overflow the basket. While Cuisinart offers this feature, it is not recommended that you pour coffee before the cycle has reached completion, since the coffee brewed at the beginning of the cycle has a flavor profile which is very different from the coffee made at the end of the cycle. Removing the cup during the brewing cycle will alter the flavor of the finished pot. When the brewing cycle is completed, five beeps will sound. Coffee will continue to stream from the filter for several seconds. After brewing, the unit will automatically shut itself off. The thermal carafe will keep the coffee hot for hours.

Mancini 3.0 out of 5 stars I'm comparing this product to the Cappresso machine with a built in grinder that I had for over 12 years and just loved. When it died, I knew i wanted another coffee maker with a built in grinder. I read several reviews indicating that the later model Cappressos weren't as good as they used to be. Plus this Cuisinart was rated very highly, so I thought I'd try it. First, the pluses. 1. It makes excellent tasting coffee. 2. It seems to be well made and very durable. Now, the minuses. 1. The grinder is LOUD. It's basically obnoxious. And it goes for a full 30 seconds, which can feel like an eternity. Don't plan on getting up before the rest of your household and starting a pot of coffee unnoticed. It will wake up even the heaviest of sleepers. Plus it's a blade grinder, which is not as good as the burr grinder in the Cappressos. 2. The cleaning process is a nightmare. There are 5 different pieces that MUST be cleaned each time. The steam from the brewing process gets into the grinder, which becomes caked with soggy coffee grounds.
